The Council discussed options of what to do with the depot. Ricky Royall will compile a list of repairs. The helipad will need to be relocated and Lee Wommack will get requirements from Air-Med. Findings will be updated at the next council meeting.

Mayor Gohman said that the scope needs to be broader on what to do with the land behind the depot. It has been zoned as a neighborhood zone. The Council discussed other options to use this land. Until the City gets the land cleaned up, no one will want to build. A helicopter pad will work but a general plan is needed.

The 2019 City holidays schedule was discussed and Lee Wommack made a motion to approve the schedule. The motion, seconded by Santiago Rodriguez, passed with a vote of 3 - 0.

The council discussed and considered taking action approving the City Secretary to submit delinquent accounts to collections. Stormy Vaughn asked why some accounts are more than others and if they were delinquent before services were shut off or the customer moved. Teresa Ballard explained that once it is known that the customer moved away from town, there is a policy to wait 30 days before turning off services. Some of the collections end up being almost 3 months old. Stormy Vaughn reported that the landlord/tenant law says when the tenant is

presented with a letter of delinquency, the tenant has three days to either pay or move out. She said that the council might need to review the policy and asked if it is the city's policy or a law. Teresa explained that when a \$300 bill was probably 6 weeks delinquent, a bill goes out, and then there is no activity, a 30 day period is observed before disconnecting services. Stormy Vaughn states that if there is no activity, then the city is out the month's trash container bill and the set base rate for water/sewer services but the water/sewer services didn't really lose money because no water was used. She also asked if the city is just collecting their fees by sending to collections. Teresa explained that the city staff notifies the customer when they are late and that they have to pay or be disconnected. Stormy Vaughn states that the city may actually be saving money by sending to collections the people that skipped out and not paid by not providing "free" services to customers that don't pay. Teresa states that there are less bills being sent to collections this year than previous years. The collection agency is collecting bad debt because the city is receiving funds from the collection agency. Lee Wommack made a motion to approve the delinquent list be sent to collections and was seconded by Stormy Vaughn. The motion passed with a vote of 3 - 0.
