Joke County Water Supply Corporation awarded grant

The Texas Water Resources Institute (TWRI) announced a grant award to Joke County Water Supply Corporation for the construction of a water treatment plant. The grant is valued at \$200,000 and will be used to fund the design and construction of a new water treatment plant. The plant will have a capacity of 10 million gallons per day and will be located in the town of Joke. The grant is part of TWRI's ongoing efforts to improve water infrastructure in rural areas of Texas.
