Coke County receives needed moisture this week

much needed moisture Sunday, Monday and overnight into Tuesday morning. This moisture fell as snowfall in much of the county with reports of up to 6" of heavy wet snow. Snow was heavier on the west side of the county. Fortunately, as snow fell in some areas, rain was falling on the rest of the county. North of Bronte, the moisture was mainly rainfall with reports of just over 1.5".

Last year, 2011, was one for the record books in more ways than one. Record heat and record drought led to a hopefully once in a lifetime record fire season.

The average rainfall of the Observer/Enterprise rainfall contributors for 2011 was only 9.51" for the entire year. The average yearly rainfall total for these same contributors over 2008, 2009, and 2010 was 24.31" per year. This reflects a deficit of 14.80" for 2011.

There is an upside to all this depressing news. Admittedly, Coke County received much less than half of its normal rainfall total in 2011. However, half or more

Coke County received of that yearly total fell in the last quarter of the year -October, November and December.

> Looking at the rainfall totals of 2010, it is apparent that the serious deficit began in the last quarter of 2010. We can hope that the last quarter of 2011 reflects the beginning of a season of normal to above average precipitation levels.
