Tax package, spending bill pass House, Senate

Coke County farmers and ranchers can breathe a sigh of relief as Congress passed a pair of bills that provide funding for rural Texas and agriculture programs, save the country \$1 billion in retaliatory tariffs and permanently

for farmers and ranchers.

"The omnibus spending bill, just passed by the House and Senate, calls for funding for rural development, food and drug safety, financial market oversight, nutrition, research and marketing programs across the nation,"Coke John Ross Copeland said.

It also includes a provision calling for the repeal of country of origin labeling (COOL) requirements for help farmers and ranchers put beef and pork exports. Mexico and their money to work."

extend small business tax breaks Canada were poised to impose \$1 billion in retaliatory tariffs if COOL wasn't repealed.
