#### Essays from West of 98 Stand Up and Be Counted

By James M. Decker Today, I am deviating slightly from my new series on action that leads to community transformation. I am writing this essay on Martin Luther King Jr.



Department and Texas Parks and Wildlife Officers responded to several brush pile fires west of Robert Lee near Paint Creek Road and Harmon Lane on Saturday, January 18, 2020. Coke County is, and was, under a burn ban. The piles had been left unattended after being lit and one of the piles had already set the surrounding pastureland on fire.

Day and I would be remiss not to use Dr. King's inspiration for today's writing. As has become my tradition, I want to share with you some of my thoughts from Dr. King's April 16, 1963 masterpiece "Letter from a Birmingham Jail."

Yet, maybe I'm not deviating from my new series at all. If you've read my last two essays, then you know my mind is currently fixed on actions that change our communities' perception with both residents and outside onlookers. Dr. King's letter represents that idea better than just about any writing you can find. King was responding to a group of eight clergymen—Catholic, white

had joined together in a letter telling Dr. King and his fellow short, if the protestors would just be patient long enough, they'd get their rights.

Dr. King was appalled. He

Protestant, and Jewish—who had been told "wait!" foryears, to no avail. In were openly ignoring this ostensible law of the land. Dr. King rightly believed that "wait' has almost always meant 'never.""


