

Ivey/Ford Scholarships to be awarded

The Coke County Commissioners Court met in regular session December 9, 2013, at the courthouse in Robert Lee. Members of the court present included County Judge, Roy Blair, Commissioner, Pct. #1 Troy Montgomery, Commissioner, Pct. #2 Wendell Lee, Commissioner, Pct. #3 Gaylon Pitcock, Commissioner, Pct. #4 Bobby Blaylock. The meeting opened with prayer given by Commissioner Pitcock and pledge to the flag was recited. Judge Blair announced the presence of a quorum.

Commissioner Lee made a motion to approve the minutes for November 25. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Blaylock. Motion carried.

Treasurer Hal Spain presented his report. Commissioner Blaylock made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner

Montgomery. Motion carried.

County Agent Jan Yanez presented her extension report and her 2013 Outcome Summaries.

Sheriff Wayne McCutchen presented his report.

Tax Collector's Report was presented by Deputy Rosa Longoria.

Judge Blair presented County/District Clerk Mary Grim's report.

Constable Precinct 1 Marshall Millican presented his report for September, October and November.

Constable Precinct 2 Marty Boyd's report was presented by Judge Blair.

Justice of the Peace Pct. 1 Walker presented her report.

Justice of the Peace Pct. 2 Coulter's report was presented by Judge Blair.

D.R. Report was unavailable.

Judge Blair presented the Trapper's Report for 10/01/2012 to 9/30/2013 and one for 10/1/2013 to 10/31/2013.

No action was taken on the Burn Ban.

Judge Blair presented a request from Robert Lee Care Center for a refund of \$545.13 stating that the Thunderbird Bus had not been available to the facility.

Commissioner Montgomery made a motion to not pay the refund. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lee. Motion carried.

Commissioner Lee made a motion prohibiting certain fireworks (large fireworks with fins and rockets) in unincorporated areas of Coke County. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Blaylock. Motion carried.

With lack of a motion for the ballot for the Coke County Appraisal District Board of Director's for 2013-2014, the court left it as is.

Commissioner Montgomery made a motion to approve the bonds for Constable Pct. 1 Marshall Millican and Tax A/C Josie Dean. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lee. Motion carried.

Commissioner Lee made a motion to approve the 2012 Annual Report from Tax A/C Josie Dean. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lee. Motion carried.
