#### RL4Restoration meeting set for January 10

RL4Restoration will hold their first meeting of 2021 on Sunday, January 10. The meeting will begin at 5 pm at the First United Methodist Church in Robert Lee. Discussion will include plans for the upcoming year and an update on the grant application and next steps.

### County Stock Show slated for January 15-16

The 82nd edition of the Coke County Junior Livestock Show will be held Friday, January 15, and Saturday, January 16, at the Sterling Lindsey Memorial Exhibition Building in Robert Lee.

The 2020 show will look a little different from past years due to Covid-19. There will be no meal, concession stand, and no live sale. The barns will be closed to the public and masks will be required at all times for exhibitors and parents.

The event will kick off at Thursday, January 14, at 4 pm when exhibitors may begin moving steers into the barn, entering at the south side.

Beginning at 8 am on Friday, January 15, at 8 am, steers will be weighed and classed.

The Steer Show will kick off at 11 am. Exhibitors may begin moving hogs in to the barns on the north side at 1 pm.

Saturday, January 16, will begin with hogs weighed and classed beginning at 8 am on the north side of the barn.

Rabbits may also begin being moved into the barn (south side) at 8 am.

The Hog show will begin at 10 am with the Sheep and Goat Shows beginning at 3 pm.

The Rabbit Show will be held between the Hog and Sheep/ Goat Shows. Sheep and Goats will be weighed in and classed beginning at 1 pm.

Upon completion of each show, all exhibitors are asked to load their animals and exit the barns.

#### '64 Study Club to not hold phone bank for WTRC Telethon

The response of Coke County citizens to the Telethon over the years, and the continuing program of WTRC will always gain respect and appreciation.
