The Robert Lee JV Steers defeated Garden City last Thurday, 52-6, ending in the 4th quarter.

The JV Steers were led by Jake Jackson on offense, who rushed for 186 yards and 2 touchdowns. Martin Jiminez ran for a touchdown and had an interception. Bruce Buddin caught 4 Jackson passes for 62 yards and 2 touchdowns, had a 65 yard kickoff return for a touchdown, and kicked 5 of 7 PATs.. Blaine Yanez caught one Jackson pass for a 40 yard touchdown.

JR Aldridge and Tristen Hildebrand led the JV Steers on defense with 8 and 5 tackles respectfully. Jackson was 8 of 12 for 129 yards throwing and had 6 tackles and an interception on the defensive side.

After trailing 0-12 at the end of the first quarter, the Robert Lee Junior High Dogies managed to pull within a touchdown of Garden City early in the second, with a 6 yard run and a PAT run by Jesse Ramon to pull within 5, trailing 7-12,

but it was all Garden City after that, as the Dogies fell to defeat, 7-45. Matthew Curry was 2 for 2 for 55 yards of passing, with Ramon on the receiving end of both passes. Tavo Rangel led the Steers on defense with several tackles.
