## Blackwell falls just short in battle of the Hornets

The Blackwell Hornets were unable to overcome the visiting Highland Hornets last Friday night, falling 60-76.

Jayden Jones led the scoring for Blackwell with four rushing touchdowns and one touchdown reception for a total of 30 points and 5 touchdowns. Mason Magness posted the only other rushing touchdown.

Matthew Lowry was 11 of 18 for 177 yards and 3 touchdowns passing. Catching Lowry's touchdown passes were Jones, Franck Cano, and Ted Chambliss. The remainder of Blackwell's points were from safeties - Wade Allen with 5 and Kaleb Edwards with 1.

## Texas reservoirs may reach "all-time" lows

Texas reservoir levels continue to drop-nearing "all-time" lows, according to the state climatologist-and could cause significant water shortages across the state if conditions do not improve.

"Our state is facing very serious water supply issues," said John Ross Copeland, president of Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau. "Without substantial rainfall, we will face more than just water restrictions.

Reservoirs are drying up, leaving less water to sustain our communities, further our industries and grow our food."

Severe heat during the summer months reduced levels, and little rain fell to replenish the state's water resources. What water remains is utilized by a growing state population, which is predicted to grow to 46 million people in fewer than 50 years.

"It is important that we establish a way to allocate funds and ensure that our state has enough water for a sustainable future," John Ross said. "We need to take action now to ensure that our reservoirs don't run dry."

Texans will vote on a fund to prioritize and finance water resource programs through a constitutional amendment, designated on the November ballot as Proposition 6. If approved, Proposition 6 will establish a self-sus-

taining account to facilitate water projects in both rural and urban communities across the state.

Texans can vote on Proposition 6 on Nov. 5 or during early voting, Oct. 21-Nov. 1.

## Perry endorsing Proposition 6

Governor Rick Perry held a Press Conference October 2, 2013, at the San Angelo State Park S. Shore Boat Ramp at O. C. Fisher Lake. Jeffie Roberts and William "Bill" Hood were invited from the Governor's Office and attended the event. Jeffie is Chairman of the Upper Colorado River Authority and Bill is Secretary of the UCRA Board. They represent Coke County on the Board of Directors. Governor Perry was promoting Proposition 6 which will be on the November ballot. If you vote YES \$2 billion will be transferred from the Rainy Day fund to the Water Fund.
