Texas reservoirs may reach "all-time"

lows

Texas reservoir levels continue to drop-nearing "all-time" lows, according to the state climatologistand could cause significant water shortages across the state if conditions do not improve.

"Our state is facing very serious water supply issues," said John Ross Copeland, president of Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau. "Without substantial rainfall, we will face more than just restrictions.

> Severe heat during the levels, and little rain fell to replenish the state's water resources. water remains is utilized by a growing state population, which is predicted to grow to 46 million people in fewer than 50 years.

" It is important that we establish a way to allocate funds and ensure that our state has enough water for a sustainable future," John Ross said. "We need to take action now to ensure that our reservoirs don't run dry."

Texans will vote on a fund to prioritize and finance water resource programs through a constitutional amendment, designated on the November ballot as Proposition 6. If approved, Proposition 6 will establish a self-sustaining account to facilitate water projects in both rural and urban communities across the state.

Texans can vote on Proposition 6 on Nov. 5 or during early voting, Oct. 21-Nov. 1.

Jeffie Roberts and William "Bill" Hood were invited from the Governor's Office and attended the event. Jeffie is Chairman of the Upper Colorado River Authority and Bill is Secretary of the UCRA Board. They represent Coke County on the Board of Directors. Governor Perry was promoting Proposition 6 which will be on the November ballot. If you vote YES \$2 billion will be transferred from the Rainy Day fund to the Water Fund.
