ATTENTION ALL REGISTERED VOTERS IN PRECINCTS 2 & 4 IN COKE COUNTY!!

My name is Jennifer Addona and within the week I will be submitting an application called *Application for Local Option Election Petition* to Mary Grim, Coke County Clerk, in order to try to get a proposal of legalizing the sale of beer and wine for on-site consumption, on a ballot at next year's general election.

Currently it is illegal to sell beer and wine for on-site consumption (i.e., to be sold and served in a restaurant in accordance to TABC guidelines). It is legal however, for the local stores to sell beer and wine.

This Application for a Petition is the first step in getting this proposal on a ballot, and it includes some general information along with ten (10) qualified (registered voter) signatures along with their printed names. In addition, proof of a published newspaper notice regarding this process will be submitted.

Once the application has been approved, the Clerks office will provide me with blank petition pages. I will then have 60 days to gather the required amount of valid signatures and submit it back to the Clerks office. The number of signatures needed is based on a percentage of the turnout from the last general election, and that number will be provided to me.

(For a signature to be valid, the signature must be by a REGISTERED VOTER in PRECINCTS 2 or 4, be accompanied by the signer's printed name, date of birth, county of registration, residence address, and date of signing.)

Once completed, I will submit the petition pages to the Clerks office, where it will be verified and approved, and subsequently the Commissioners Court will order the proposal to be put on a ballot at next year's general election.

This is how I understand the process to work.

Your signature on this petition does not necessarily mean that you favor this proposal; but it will show that you are in favor of putting this proposal on a ballot so it can be voted on by you!

> I am hopeful that this proposal passes, and I would then move forward and apply for a **Beer and Wine Permit** through the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC).

My plans are to open a restaurant on the corner of HWY 277 & 158, and to sell and serve beer and wine to customers, which would include locals, tourists, and the many loyal hunters that visit our community during the hunting seasons.

I will place notices in the newspaper to update you on my progress. I look forward to seeing and hearing from, and appreciate your support!
