

Station 4 was the inside of the Farris Lodge where the students were treated to a tour from Mark Wright and Noel Gregston. Mr. Wright and Mr. Gregston showed students mounts of various animals; including a buffalo, greater and

She gave them information on lesser Kudu from Africa, and a bear. Here the students were able to observe the skulls of several animals and learn about how their distinct features help them in the wild. Stoney Newberry, Texas Parks and Wildlife Biologist, showed the teeth of deer and how they are used in determining the age of the animal.

At Station 5, Game Warden David Hopkins gave the students a gun safety short course. He explained to them the importance of proper handling and how gun safety is the responsibility of everyone.
