

### Hornets hold strong against Blanket

In their closest win of the 2013 football season, the Blackwell Hornets defeated the Blanket Tigers 48-34 to now stand at 5-0.

Quarterback Matthew Lowry led his team in the air with 8 out of 10 completed passes for 4 touchdowns. Catching the ball for touchdowns were Franck Cano, Mason Magness, Ted Chambliss and Jayden Jones. Franck Cano added another touchdown on the ground with Jayden Jones posting two more touchdowns on the ground for the Hornets.

Rounding out the Hornets' scoring with 6 points were the PATs by Wade Allen.

#### Statistics

Matthew Lowry had 8-10 and 110 yards passing and carried the ball twice for an additional 12 yards. He also had 12 tackles.

Jayden Jones carried the ball 16 times for 183 yards and 2 touchdowns, had 2 receptions for 13 yards and 1 touchdown, had 10 tackles and 1 fumble recovery.

Franck Cano carried the ball 8 times for 136 yards and 1 touchdown, had 1 reception for 6 yards and 1 touchdown, and had 3 tackles.

Mason Magness had 3 receptions for 54 yards and 1 touchdown, one 14 yard kick off return, and 15 tackles.

Ted Chambliss caught the ball twice for 37 yards and 1 touchdown, carried the ball once for 2 yards, and had 5 tackles.

Kaleb Edwards posted 6 tackles, with Ethan Andrews posting 3 tackles and Oakley Anderson posting 2 tackles to the stat sheet.

Tonight is Homecoming for Blackwell and the Hornets will be taking on the Veribest Falcons at 7:30 pm.
