Bronte's defense started the game with a goal line stand at the one foot line as the Jackets were stopped on 4th and goal. The Horns responded with a 99 yard drive that ended with a Mizael Perez touchdown. Both teams each had a single possession in

the first quarter, and the momentum was with the Horns. The Horns would score again in the second quarter when Kyler Richards hit Joshua Puentez with a 53 yard pass play and following Mizael Perez's PAT, the Horns led 14-0. Menard would score just a few minutes later on a 38 yard pass play but the PAT was blocked giving the Horns a 14-6 lead at halftime. The Horns were able to get a field goal try just before the half, but it too, was blocked.

To start the third quarter, the Horns scored on a 38 yard pass from Richards to Jared Scott. This gave the Horns a little breathing room, but that is when the Jackets went on a tear. They scored four times in the second half and took an 11 point lead. Bronte would score in the final five minutes to cut the lead to 5 when Richards connected with Puentez
