"The constitutional amendment providing for the issuance of additional general obligation bonds by the Texas Water Development Board in an amount not to exceed \$6 billion at any time outstanding.'

## Proposition 3 - SJR 50

"The constitutional amendment providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds of the State of Texas to finance educational loans to students."

## Proposition 5 - SJR 26

"The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to allow cities or counties to enter into interlocal contracts with other cities or counties without the imposition of a tax or the provision of a sinking fund."

## Proposition 6 - HJR 109

"The constitutional amendment clarifying references to the permanent school fund, allowing the General Land Office to distribute revenue tion of certain elected county from permanent school fund land or other properties to the they become candidates for available school fund to provide additional funding for public education, and providing for an increase in the market value of the permanent school fund for the purpose of allowing increased distributions from the available school fund."

## Proposition 9 - SJR 9

"The constitutional amendment authorizing the governor to grant a pardon to a person

who successfully completes a term of deferred adjudication community supervision."

## Proposition 10 - SJR 37

"The constitutional amendment to change the length of the unexpired term that causes the automatic resignaor district officeholders if another office."

## Proposition 8 - SJR 16

"The constitutional amendment providing for the appraisal for ad valorem tax purposes of open-space land devoted to water-stewardship purposes on the basis of its productive capacity."
