"There will be almost no dryland acres, and the irrigated crop is going to be greatly reduced from last year. We're looking at a huge reduction on the production side."

Texas farmers planted about 7.1 million acres of cotton, but less than half - about 2.2 million acres - are expected to be harvested. The U.S. Department of Agriculture is

forecasting the smallest U.S. cotton crop in 13 years, attributing the decline in acres to the drought.

Farmers in the High Plains are used to dry conditions. Normal precipitation for the area is about 20 inches, according to West.

As of late August, the area had seen less than six inches of rain for the entire year.

"We had hope, but that hope dwindled as the summer and the drought continued to linger. The crop got French fried in the summer," he said. "There's a lot of these cotton fields that didn't even have enough moisture to get the seed germinated and get them established. So, there's a lot of bare ground in and around the area. And then there's a lot of irrigated acres that got established, but the heat and the lack of subsoil moisture underneath the fields, we just couldn't keep up even with the
