Pasture, range and forage insurance deadline nears

Coke County farmers and ranchers are reminded the deadline to sign up and report acreage for pasture, range and forage insurance for 2014 is Nov. 15.

"Insurance is a critical component of many operations because farming and ranching is a gamble," said John Ross Copeland, Coke County Farm Bureau president. "The policy can offer stability during these consecutive years of drought and other extreme adverse conditions."

Producers can determine any number of acres to insure, but must also select a minimum of two-month intervals or a maximum of six two-month intervals

Farm bill negotiators line up priorities

With a conference committee finally selected, Coke County Farm Bureau leaders are encouraged that farm bill legislation is finally moving.

"Resolving the differences between the Senate and House versions of the 2013 farm bill is imperative to ensure a full, five-year policy is enacted," said Coke County Farm Bureau President John Ross Copeland. "The recent meeting signals pro-

gress is being made, but there is still much to be done."

John Ross Copeland said new farm legislation is important to consumers and farmers.

"The farm bill is an investment in America's food security," John Ross Copeland said. "It helps farmers remain on the land in times of natural disasters and ensures consumers an abundant and affordable food supply."

Coverage levels between 70 and 90 percent are available. "After the producer selects a coverage level, then a productivity factor, which is a percentage of the established county base value for forage, is chosen," John Ross Copeland said.
