### TxDOT road decision carries serious implications

A decision by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) to convert existing paved roadways in six Texas counties to gravel carries serious implications for the Farm-to-Market road system in Texas, said John Ross Copeland, Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau president.

"Because of limited funds and a sharp increase in heavy traffic from the oil and gas booms, TxDOT says maintaining these roadways is too expensive," John Ross Copeland said. "We disagree." John Ross Copealnd said the 83rd Texas Legislature passed much-needed legis-

Transportation Reinvestment Zones.

Farm Bureau has asked Governor Rick Perry to intervene, John Ross Copeland said. Farmers and ranchers depend on Farm-to-Market roads to move their crops and livestock to market and to move services to and from rural towns.
