**Painting with the colors of Coke County**

Art is all around us. In the wind blowing the tall grasses, our breathtaking sunsets, and even the soil. Art tells a story, far back in history there is evidence of this in cave drawings; artists using the mediums readily available to them.

The Bronte and Robert Lee kindergarten classes did the same using the soils of Coke County. District Technician of the Coke County Soil and Water Conservation District, Erin Oleksiuk, gathered different soil types for the students to paint pictures. District Conservationist, Mark Sides with the USDA-NRCS office, worked with her to determine the soil types and their characteristics.

The students learned about different animals, insects, and even a microorganism, called a Water Bear, which live in soil or make their home in burrows. The students learned that all of these make Coke County soils healthy by fertilizing, aerating, and cleaning them. The kindergartners then got the chance to be both scientist and artist. They first looked at each soil and thought about what color they would make when the water was added. They then observed the different types in cups while the soils were dry. The little scientist then had to look and listen as water was added to each soil; some gave off dust, others foamed and fizzed. When it was time to paint, each artist created wonderful masterpieces of dark brown, tan, and red. The students had a great time learning and creating. If we all take time to teach the children

in our lives about being good remain beautiful for future stewards of the land, it will generations to enjoy.
