Representative Visits! Coke County's State Representative Drew Darby visited in both Robert Lee and Bronte, Wednesday morning, November 10, 2021. He is shown here speaking to a smaller group in Robert Lee. He discussed redistricting and how he now will also represent Coleman County. Darby pointed out that of 150 representatives in the Texas House of Representatives, there are only 17 representatives for all of Texas west of I-35. Texas lawmakers only meet in odd number years and between the regular session and the special sessions in 2021, they passed a total of 666 new bills. He warned that the electric grid issues have not been completely resolved and that citizens need to be prepared with generators, etc. for a Farmers Almanac predicted storm in January. He explained that among the problems revealed during last winter's storm were the lack of weatherization of natural gas, wind generation, and nuclear electric plants. He also revealed that production of natural gas heading to natural gas power plants had not been considered critical infrastructure and therefore, had not been exempt from rolling blackouts held during that time. Also discussed during the meeting were the frayed relationships between members of opposing parties following the session where 51 democrat representatives traveled to Washington, DC, to prevent a quorum of members and therefore brought business in the Texas House to a standstill.
