Item 9: Motion made by councilman Burns and seconded by Councilman Johnson to discuss entering into a contract with CNHI for lease of a utility tractor. After discussion, vote called. Councilman Alexander, Councilman Johnson voted for and Councilman Burns voted against. Motion carried.

Item 10: Motion made to select Leroy Casey as a delegate to the Concho Valley Council of Governments' General Assembly. Motion by Councilman Alexander and second by Councilman Burns. Motion passed.

Item 11: Motion to change authorized signatories from John Jacobs to Leroy Casey on the storage tank rehab project. Motion made by councilman Burns and second by Councilman Alexander. Motion passed.

Item 12: Motion made to increase the water rates for Robert Lee customers the same amount that Bronte has increased the water rates for Robert Lee; 30 cents per thousand gallons by Councilman Alexander and second by Councilman Burns. Motion passed.

Meeting adjourned at 10:00 pm.

The meeting on November 9 was called to order at 7:01 pm and an invocation was given by Councilman Johnson and an open forum was presented.

Item 1: Presentation for Texas Ground Water Surveyors on the seismologic method of finding a reliable water source. The success rate and overall process of operation. It was the consensus of the council to explore this option further.

Item 2: Motion made by Councilman Alexander and seconded by Councilman Johnson to approve a water tap at 1423 Austin. Motion carried.

Item 3: A motion was made by Councilwoman Munoz and seconded by Councilwoman Rainwater that the owner of 1423 Austin be informed of the challenges of a sewer tap in this location. Recommended that the property owner contact a contractor as to the cost of boring under Austin Street and to the possibility of not being able to connect to the city sewer system due to the location and elevation. All at owners cost. Motion carried

Item 4: Discussed future water sources and existing water well in the state right of way on Highway 2034. Discussed electronic water meters and are still waiting for word from Texas Water Development Board. Discussed the possibility of blending "good" water with brine water. Looking at additional options south of Coke

County

Item 8: Motion made by Councilman Alexander and seconded by Councilman Johnson to approve the Animal Control Officers report. Vote taken and passed.

Item 9: Motion made to establish a policy of responsibility of the animal shelter in the absence of the Animal Control Officer by Councilman Alexander and seconded by Councilwoman Munoz. After discussion it was decided that since the Animal Control Officer is an independent contractor they are responsible for having a substitute in his absence. Vote carried.

Item 10: Motion made by Councilwoman Munoz and seconded by Councilwoman Rainwater to divide the number of votes allotted to the city on the Coke County Appraisal District official ballot as follows Sid Burns 33 votes and Leroy Casey 32 votes. Motion carried.

Item 11: Motion made by Councilman Alexander and seconded by Councilwoman Munoz to approve The end of the year 2014-2015 budget review and amendment. Motion carried.
