

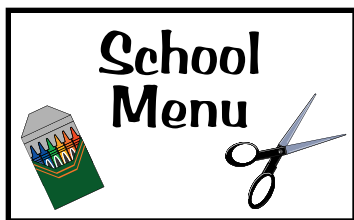

football season came to an end this past Friday as the Longhorns fell to the Iraan Braves by a score of 35-14. The Horns finish the year at 7-4 and were runner-up in District 6-1 with a 4-2 record for district games.

Iraan scored first on a 47 yard pass and took a 7-0 lead in the first quarter. Bronte responded on their next possession with a 79 yard TD run by Thoren Charles. The PAT by Mizael Perez was good and tied the game at 7-7. Iraan regained the lead just before halftime on 21 yard pass play but missed the PAT and led 13-7 at the half. In the second half, the Longhorns defense controlled the Iraan offense as Mizael Perez and Ty Lee intercepted Brave passes. Ty returned his 50 yards to the Iraan 7 yard line. Three plays later, Ty scored from one yard out and the PAT by Perez gave the Horns the lead at 14-13. The Braves would take the lead for good shortly after the Longhorns score on a 12 yard run. The 2 point conversion was good and the Braves led

21-14. The Braves would score 2 more times in the 4th quarter to win the Bi-district ball game 35-14.

The 2012 season was fun and exciting. The kids played hard and represented our school and community with class. Special thanks to all of the volunteers that helped make the season a success and for all the help in making our home games work so smoothly.
