## Covid-19 numbers in Coke County improve

After a couple of really awful weeks, Coke County's numbers have improved significantly. Coke County Judge Hal Spain pointed out last Friday (October 30, 2020) that Bronte Nursing Home was down from 25 to 6 active Covid-19 cases with Robert Lee Care Center down from 21 to 11 active Covid-19 cases. On Tuesday, November 2, 2020, Coke County was reported to have 129 overall confirmed Covid-19 cases since the pandemic started last March. Active cases for Coke County on Tuesday stood at 49, with 7 fatalities and 73 recoveries. Active cases in Coke County reached of a high of 68 on Wednesday, October 28, 2020.

of the month and down below 2% the first two days of November to 1.99%.

Most neighboring counties have seen a spike in recent weeks, but also appear to be improving. As of Tuesday, November 2, 2020, Mitchell County had 202 overall cases, 48 active cases 2 fatalities and 152 recoveries. Nolan County had 441 overall cases, 81 active cases, 7 fatalities, and 353 recoveries. Taylor County had 2,322 overall cases, 653 active cases, 69 fatalities, and 1,600 recoveries. Sterling County had 21 overall cases, 11 active cases, 0 fatalities and 10 recoveries. Runnels County had 303 overall cases, 5 active cases, 9 fatalities and 294 recoveries. Irion County had 14 cases overall, 2 active cases, 0 fatalities, and 12 recoveries. Tom Green County had 2,672 cases overall, 227 active cases, 82 fatalities, and 2,363 recoveries. Concho County had 144 overall cases, 6 active cases, 2 fatalities and 136 recoveries.

Case numbers in Texas and across the numbers went up in November, but perhaps the most important number citizens should look at went down over the course of the month. The fatality rate of all Texas citizens confirmed to have Covid-19 fell from 2.10% at the beginning of the month to 2.00% at the end
