Hornets - 50 yard interception return with 4:01 left, PAT kick good


4th Quarter

Students interested in taking the December 14, 2013 ACT test must register by Friday, November 8, 2013 in order to avoid late fees. Students may register online at www.actstudent.org or pick up an application in the high school counselor's office. The cost of the ACT test is \$36.50 or \$52.50 if a student registers for the ACT Plus Writing test. If someone is unsure which test to sign up for, please consult the high school counselor.

Blackwell Red Ribbon Week! Blackwell CISD observed Red Ribbon Week October 28 through November 1. DPS State Trooper Shawn Baxter talked to the elementary students about drug awareness and gun safety. Regarding gun safety, the elementary students learned that if they see a gun, they are to first, "don't touch it", second "leave" and third "go tell an adult." Trooper Baxter also told the students to treat every gun they see as a "loaded" gun. Elementary students also received various items including color booklets and activity pages as well as pencils, pens and stickers.

Trooper Baxter also spoke to the junior high and high school students about drug awareness and making good choices.
