Those present included County Judge Roy Blair, Commissioner Precinct 1 Donald Robertson, Commissioner Precinct 3 Marshall Millican, and Deputy Clerk Monica Reyes.

The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag and prayer was offered by Judge Blair.

Judge Blair announced the presence of a quorum. Commissioners Williams and Sefcik were absent.

A motion to accept the extension of the contract for electricity with TASB was made by Commissioner Millican. The motion, seconded by Commissioner Robertson, carried.

Judge Blair adjourned the meeting at 9:08 am.

Commissioner Millican made a motion to approve the request from the City of Robert Lee to change the name of Landfill Road to Red Canyon Road. Commissioner Robertson seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Commissioner Robertson made a motion to pay the bills and was seconded by Commissioner Sefcik. The motion carried.

Judge Blair adjourned the meeting at 9:41 am.
