## Audubon Bird Count set for December 19

The annual Audubon Christmas Bird Count will be conducted in Coke County on Saturday, December 19, by the Midland Naturalists who will gather at a local cafe at 7:45 a.m. Local birders are invited to join them to visit or go on a counting trek. This will be the 116th bird count of the Audubon Society.

There are almost 90 species of birds that are here, or migrate through, this area.

Anyone interested in the program can find the best information by a Google search of the Christmas Bird Count.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife/ Texas Department of Transportation nature map lists five birding sites in the Coke County Caliche Loop. One more site will be added with publication of a new map next month.

The group will travel the back roads of the county and will stop at various locations with binoculars ready. There will be an estimated 72,650 bird counters across the whole North American Continent to count birds in our shared environment.

A backyard bird count will be

alcohol is involved," said TxDOT Executive Director LtGen Joe Weber, USMC (Ret). "Our goal is to save families from the heartbreak of losing a loved one. Finding a sober ride is easy and it can save you from being arrested, injured or killed. There is no excuse for drinking and driving."

During last year's holiday season (Dec. 1, 2014 - Jan. 1, 2015) there were 2,412 alcoholrelated traffic crashes in Texas, resulting in 190 serious injuries and 110 fatalities. This was nearly an 8-percent increase in alcohol-related traffic fatalities over the previous holiday season.

Central to the Plan While You Can campaign is a statewide tour featuring an interactive dodgeball game that uses custom gaming technology to replicate the effects of alcohol on a person's reflexes. As participants play, virtual drinks are added and the players' onscreen avatars become less able to dodge incoming "snowballs." The game demonstrates how even one drink can slow reaction

## TxDOT announces new campaign

The Texas Department of Transportation's "Plan While You Can" campaign urges party goers to plan for a sober ride this holiday season. The campaign runs through Jan. 1, 2016 and coincides with an increase in DUI patrols and enforcement.

"The holidays are a time of celebration and family, but they also require responsible decisions and planning if
