DSHS changes to Covid-19 website provide sporadic updates

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) Covid-19 dashboard received a new look on December 11, 2020. Not only was the appearance of the website changed, but they also changed how different categories and percentages reported were calculated.

The overall case numbers reported prior to update only included cases confirmed by Now DSHS is reporting probable cases as well. These probable cases are being "included in the calculations of active and recovered cases". DSHS defines probable cases as "those identified through antigen testing or a combination of symptoms and a known exposure without a more likely diagnosis".

With the first reports following the updates, almost all counties saw a huge jump in both the number of active cases and the number of recoveries. However in the time period beginning with the update on December 11 and ending with the December 14 reports, unbelievably no changes to any categories have been reported for Mitchell and Nolan counties. These two counties also show absolutely no probable cases at all. In Coke County and some of the other counties in our area, numbers that should only rise, such as the overall confirmed cases and overall probable case numbers, have jumped both up and down over the last few days. The state seems to be having to work out some of the kinks of the new reporting.

As we reported last week, it has been difficult to know whose numbers are accurate

since the very beginning last spring. Often numbers have been attributed to "Tom Green County" or the "City of San Angelo" that are actually regional numbers gathered from citizens who may have been tested or hospitalized in San Angelo but are not residents of Tom Green County. The numbers received sporadically by local officials include more detail, but are usually a number of days old and are not as current as the numbers listed on the DSHS's website. These numbers on the DSHS website are supposed to be updated on a daily basis, but as mentioned above, it appears since the changes that some counties have not been updated

On Monday, December 14, 2020, DSHS reported Coke County had 197 cases overall confirmed by testing (2 less than the previous week); 137 overall probable cases; 63 active cases from both confirmed and probable categories 9 fatalities and 262 recoveries of cases

confirmed by testing and probable.

On Monday, December 14, 2020, Coke County Courthouse was once again open to officials, employees, and the public.

As of Monday, December 14, Texas is reporting 1,337,096 confirmed overall cases and 144,516 probable cases for a total of 1,481,612. Of this total, 259,053 are considered active and 1,185,628 are recovered. DSHS is reporting 23,937 fatalities through Monday with 9,304 Texans hospitalized with Covid-19. Over 13.5 million tests have been given to date in Texas. Fortunately, the fatality rate in Texas continues to decline.
