On Thursday morning, April 19, 2018, a truck loading condensate (drip gas) at the compressor station approximately 6 miles north of Bronte on US Highway 277 caught fire, possibly due to a wind change blowing vapors across the truck's engine. The experienced driver, Tony Holland, was able to shut off valves before escaping to safety. This action prevented the fire from reaching the storage tanks at the site. Traffic was diverted onto Morrow Loop and Old Highway Road for over an hour as the truck burned. Emergency responders included members of the Coke County Sheriff's Office, Bronte Volunteer Fire Department, Robert Lee Volunteer Fire Department and Coke County Constable Marty Boyd. 
