**NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR FLUID INJECTION WELL PERMIT**

MEMORIAL PRODUCTION OPER. LLC, 500 DALLAS STREET SUITE 1800, HOUSTON, TX 77002 is applying to the Railroad Commission of Texas for a permit to inject oil and gas waste into a formation that is productive of oil and gas.

The applicant proposes to inject fluid into the Palo Pinto, Capps, Goen, Jennings, Gardner, Odom, Caddo, & Cambrian formations, BRONTE CAMBRIAN UNIT, well number 529. The proposed injection wells are located 9 miles southwest of Sundown, Texas in the Bronte (Cambrian) field, in Coke County. Fluid will be injected into strata in the subsurface depth interval from 4500 to 6100 feet.

LEGAL AUTHORITY: Texas Water Code, Chapter 27, as amended; Texas Natural Resources Code, Title 3, as amended; and the Railroad Commission's Oil and Gas Division Rules (Statewide Rules) at 16 Tex. Admin. Code, Chapter 3.

If you have objections to the issuance of a permit for this well, you may submit a letter of protest. Protests to the application from local government or persons who object and can show that they may be adversely affected, or requests for further information concerning any aspect of the application, should be submitted in writing to the Director, Oil and Gas Division, Railroad Commission of Texas, 1701 North Congress Avenue, Austin, Texas 78711 (Telephone 512-463-6792). Unless the Commission receives a protest to the application, the director may take final administrative action on the application (e.g., approve, deny, return, or refer to hearing) no fewer than 15 days after the date the application is filed with the Commission.

Please be advised that the Railroad Commission of Texas does not have jurisdiction over roads, traffic, property values, zoning, noise, odors, esthetics, leasing, pipeline easements, or royalty payments.
