CVEC to offer scholarships

Valley Electric Concho Cooperative offers four \$2,000 scholarships each year. Two scholarships are awarded to graduating high school seniors and two are awarded to other students of higher learning.

The guidelines for scholarship are listed below.

The applicant must be an active CVEC member whose primary residence is served by CVEC or be the dependent of a CVEC member whose primary residence is served by CVEC.

The applicant will be chosen based on the following criteria: grades, leadership, community, school activities, and essay.
