We help them adopt out the socialized cats and kittens and we try our best to educate people about TNR.

We always say, "if you like cats, TNR makes sense; if you don't like cats, TNR really makes sense because it is the only effective, long-term method of reducing the numbers of community cats." Smaller numbers of ferals, healthier colonies, humane treatment of community cats – these are attainable goals that we can work for in Robert Lee and everywhere.
