The application must include three copies of the following:

- Application form (available online at lonestaragcredit.com)
- Resume containing work experience, community service, organizational involvement, and leadership positions

- List of honors, awards, and special accomplishments

- Current transcript of grades
- Two letters of recommendation from agricultural leaders (for example: teacher, farmer, rancher, extension agent, elected official)

- Two page essay sharing how agriculture and natural resources play a part in your life and what roles they'll serve in your future and career.

Winners will be notified in May and the scholarship will be issued to the college or university to which the student has been accepted. Application packets should be mailed to:

Texas Farm Bureau

Texas Farm Bureau has several scholarships available. The Dick Mitchell Scholarship is a \$1,000 scholarship awarded to one high school senior who has attended the Texas Farm Bureau Youth Leadership Conference or Virtual Leadership Conference.

The Young Farmer and Rancher Scholarship is for high school seniors pursuing a degree in agriculture. Each of Texas Farm Bureau's 13 districts will award one \$1,000 scholarship.

To acknowledge former Texas Farm Bureau president S.M. True Jr., a \$20,000 scholarship was established for college students enrolled in an undergraduate degree program with at least 60 hours of college credit and who have declared agriculture as their major. Applicants must submit a completed application and two letters of recommendation - one from the county Farm Bureau president and one from the dean or head of the agriculture department of their college or university.

The Young Farmer and Rancher Enrolled Scholarship is for students already enrolled in college pursuing their

undergraduate degrees. Applicants must have completed a minimum of 45 credit hours and have a GPA of 2.5 or higher to qualify. Three \$2,500 scholarships will be awarded.

Texas Farm Bureau has also made scholarship funds available to first-year and enrolled students attending Texas State Technical College (TSTC). Fifty \$1,000 scholarships are awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis through the Texan Success Scholarship.

Coke County Water Supply Corporation awarded grant

The Texas Water Resources Board approved a resolution on December 19, 19, awarding a grant of \$500,000 to the Coke County Water Supply Corporation. The grant is for the design and construction of a new water supply system, including a new water treatment plant, a new distribution system, and a new water storage facility. The grant is the largest ever awarded to a local government in the state.



The grant is part of a larger program to improve water infrastructure in rural areas of the state. The Texas Water Resources Board is a state agency that oversees the state's water resources.
