CVEC to offer scholarships

Concho Valley Electric Cooperative offers four \$2,000 scholarships each year. Two scholarships are awarded to graduating high school seniors and two are awarded to other students of higher learning.

The guidelines for the scholarship are listed below.

The applicant must be an active CVEC member whose primary residence is served by CVEC or be the dependent of a CVEC member whose primary residence is served by CVEC.

The applicant will be chosen based on the following criteria: grades, leadership, community, school activities, and essay.

Permissible use of the funds include payment of tuition, fees required for books, supplies, and/or equipment required for courses of instruction.

The recipient must attend a recognized Texas institution of higher education, including certified trade schools, while pursuing a degree at any level.

Recipients must obtain at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale and carry a minimum of 12 hours or be considered by the registrar to be a full-time student. One half of the scholarship is awarded at the

beginning of the fall semester and the remaining half is awarded at the beginning of the spring semester.

Deadline for submission is April 4, 2019.
