

Bronte City Council meeting minutes told

The Bronte City Council met in regular session Thursday, November 19, 2020, at 5:30 pm.

The regular city council meeting was called to order at 5:31 pm by Mayor Paul Gohman and a quorum was established. Those attendance included City Council Members Ron Cooper Santiago Rodriguez. Council Member Stormy Vaughn arrived at 5:34 pm. City Staff present included Ricky Royall, Teresa Ballard, and Tina Smith.

Mayor Paul Gohman led with the Pledge of Allegiance and offered the prayer.

There were no citizen comments.

The newly elected city officials were sworn in by City Secretary Teresa Ballard as follows: Paul Gohman as Mayor and Gwen Dyess and Kinley Pritchard as the two new Council Members. They were presented with their certificate of election.

No one was available from the Bronte Volunteer Fire Department to give the Fire Department Report to the Council. Deputy Brandon Neal gave the Sheriff's Office Report for October as follows: four calls for ordinance enforcement; five officer ordinance notifications from City Hall;

two verbal and one written warning(s) were given, with one written ordinance citation issued. Deputy Neal reported that there have been no breakin's to citizens' houses as reflected in Facebook posts. Animal Services reported one skunk and three raccoons were trapped, and two dogs were caught and held for 72 hours, then adopted out to citizens in

San Angelo. One Municipal Court summons was issued.

The Economic Development Corporation 4B board met November 9, 2020, with three loan forgiveness applications approved for \$2500 to each applicant. One Front Store Grant was approved. A public hearing will be held December 3 and following with a regular meeting agenda to finalize the paperwork for all four grants.
