One camp is a day camp on August 9 for children entering grades K-2 for the 2014 school year. The other camp is a four-day, three night camp from June 1-4 and is for students that will

be entering grades 3-12 for the 2014 school year.

It has been mentioned to me that we may be spending too much time on private road work, rather than county roads. This is a mistake on somebody's part as we are very cautious about taking on private work. Any time that I am asked to do private work I encourage the customer to see if they can get a private contractor to do the job. While we have done a few private jobs we have a contract and customer has paid for the job.

Also, I know the roads get bad, but we can only blade the roads when we have rain and as you know we are in severe drought and without moisture we cannot blade the roads. We blade roads when we have a little moisture, and most of the time it dries out before we get all of them bladed. Another problem we have is our equipment. It is old and we are constantly working on them.

Also, I believe that our Sheriff Department needs and increase in salary and have mentioned this is the past Commissioner's Court. They spend lots of hours on the job and what would we do without them? The only time we can review and address these problems is during the time that we are setting the year's budget. I will continue to work on this, but also realize the financial limitations that Coke County works under.
