Ron Sims - livestock permit: meets criteria. Steve Hines made the motion to approve livestock permit, seconded by Stormy Vaughn. Vote: 3-0 motion approve livestock permit.

Dan Stone - livestock permit: Ricky Royall recommends not using shelter by neighbor less than 100 feet from neighbor. Stormy Vaughn made the motion to deny livestock permit, seconded by Steve Hines. Vote: 3, motionpassed to deny livestock permit.

James Vaughn - livestock permit: meets criteria. Ron Cooper made the motion to approve livestock permit, seconded by Steve Hines. Vote: 2-1, Stormy Vaughn abstain, motion approve livestock permit.

Bruce and Stormy Vaughn livestock permit: meets criteria. Ron Cooper made the motion to approve livestock permit, seconded by Steve Hines. Vote: 2-1, Stormy Vaughn abstain, motion approve livestock permit.

Stormy Vaughn made the motion to authorize the mayor to sign Notice of the 2020 General Election, seconded by Ron Cooper. Vote: 4-0, motion

Notifications were emailed to six electricity brokers on Friday, January 10 to send proposals to city hall by noon, Thursday, January 16. One proposal was submitted. Subcommittee's recommendation is electricity broker TruEnergy, getting electricity with Direct Energy for 60 months, allinclusive product at 0.04307 or less. Lee Wommack made the motion to approve Direct Energy for 60 months at 0.04307 or less, seconded by

Stormy Vaughn. Vote: 4-0, motion passed.

Stormy Vaughn reported this is the second amendment to the RV RV Park ordinance. During council discussion, the city found out that the RV park is run by Coke County but is in the city limits and the amendments will need to be readdressed. Ron Cooper made the motion to table amendment to RV Park ordinance to make corrections, seconded by Steve Hines. Vote: 4-0, motion passed

Lee Wommack would like to see if the EMS and fire department could get a percentage of the EDC sales tax revenue to help the EMS and FD operating costs. Wommack made the motion to have the City Secretary to contact comptroller's office to see if there is time to get this on the ballot for election and if so, have Mr. Russel Gallahan talk her through putting on the ballot for EDC Sales Tax Revenue Funding EMS, fire department, and possibly cemetery, added as well, seconded by Steve Hines. Vote: 4 - 0, motion passed.

Stormy Vaughn made a motion to have a Ouarterly Curbside Clean-up on any Monday in February, seconded by Steve Hines. Vote: 4-0, motion passed.

City Secretary wants to rescind the sanitation credit card approved and have a cemetery credit card to keep accurate records for when inmates are working at the cemetery for meals and other costs. Stormy Vaughn made the motion to rescind the sanitation credit card and approve to have a cemetery credit card, seconded by Ron Cooper. Vote 4-0, motion

Discussion was held regarding Wi-Fi at the fire department. The City Secretary contacted West Central and they approved Wi-Fi at the department.

Change needs to be done to the back door of EMS vehicle. EMS would pay for all expenses if council would approve moving the door in the back of the EMS bay to open outward instead of inward. Ricky Royall and Paul Gohman both agreed that it would be better if the EMS would move the vehicle out of the way when they need to go through the door. Lee W ommack recommends taking off the door and new framework welded to the other side and the EMS will pay for the cost if councial approves. Stormy made the motion to approve the EMS to pay for changing out the doors, seconded by Ron C ooper. Vote: 4 -0, motion p

City Secretary would like council's approval to get a quote for signage on the outside of the city council chamber building identifying as City Council Chamber and Municipal Court Chamber. Also, a new city sign over city hall to match. Lee Wommack made the motion to approve City Secretary to get a quote and proof of signage, seconded by Ron Cooper. Vote:4-0, motion passed.

Stormy Vaughn would like to see the list of bad debt on the monthly reports. The City recently collected bad debt of \$445.67 plus collection agency fees. Also, staff is working on collecting another bad debt. Stormy Vaughn made a motion to approve aging report, seconded by Lee Wommack. Vote: 4-0, motion passed.

Stormy Vaughn reminded staff to get a copy of the fire department's insurance part to send them the insurance invoice so they can get the money from the forestry service to reimburse the city. Stormy Vaughn made the motion to approve the general fund reports, seconded by Lee Wommack. Vote: 4-0, motion passed.

Stormy Vaughn made the motion to approve water fund reports, seconded by Lee Wommack. Vote: 4-0, motion Stormy Vaughn made the

### Mayor's Report

Paul Gohman did a slideshow presentation showing council land city owns. While identifying land, we talked with the Cowboy Church to let them know the city owns a strip of land. They did not know they didn't have the whole block. The city has a strip next to their property and if we could swap, that would give the city a whole block for housing. Plats for all the property is needed. This section has septic but we need a lift station. We would apply for a block grant and that would open a whole lot of opportunities.

The Utility Director had nothing to report.

# City Secretary Report

TMRS city contribution effective January 1, increased employee retirement match by the City from the present 13.15% to 13.33% for 2020 calendar year. The City Secretary will need to amend budget to reflect this change. Staff is still cross training and working on identifying city owned properties. The city is taking applications for mayor and two council member positions until February 14, 2020.

Municipal Court is Tuesday, January 28, at 5:30 pm and there are seven on the docket.

Lee Wommack would like to discuss act range finder for code enforcement.

Stormy Vaughn reported talking to San Angelo about how Galilee was able to work with the City to build homes. There is more to come on this topic.
