Bronte ISD board meeting minutes told

The Bronte ISD Board of Trustees held a regularly scheduled meeting on November 18, 2021. Those in attendance included board members Ashley Braswell, Jodie Arrott, Josh Schoenfield, Terry Queen, John Seales, and Lynsey Coalson; administration members Tim Siler, Jennifer Englert, and Doug Kuhlmann; and guests Monique Bilyeau and Marlayna Schoenfield.

The meeting was opened at 6:01 pm with a prayer by Josh Schoenfield.

A quorum was established with six members present. Board member David McWright was absent.

Josh Schoenfield made a motion to approve the bill listing and was seconded by Ashley Braswell. The motion passed with a vote of 6 - 0.

The minutes were presented and read and a motion was made by Lynsey Coalson to approve. She was seconded by Josh Schoenfield and the motion passed with a vote of 6 - 0.

There were no audience items.

Principal's Report

Ms. Englert gave an elementary update. The elementary open house was held on November 1 and a Veteran's Day Ceremony took place on November 11 and it went really well. The Thanksgiving Lunch was last week. A reading/math assessment practice STAAR test has taken place and another will be held in the spring. UIL is coming up soon. A music program for PK-4th grade is going to be held on December 2 at 6 pm. Some of the elementary students will also go caroling at the nursing home. A few of the sixth and eighth grade students were able to attend Drew Darby's meeting at Red Barn. Mr. Kuhlman gave

his secondary update. The local livestock show will be held on December 18 with over 50 animals being shown. Two students ran in the district cross country meet and each had a personal best time. Volleyball did really well this season. Football also did really well and showed a lot of improvement. Basketball has started and a game will be played in Paint Rock on Friday. Band is going really great and Mr. Irwin is phenomenal. The junior high UIL academic meet is coming up. The snapshot number submitted was 54 students, so Mr. Kuhlmann believes that this will put Bronte in Division II for football.

There are currently 237 total students, including 146 in PK-6th and 91 in 7th-12th. ADA is 96%.

Superintendent's Update

Mr. Siler gave an update on school finances. He advised that it is still early in the year and no

unexpected costs have popped up so far. He is keeping tabs on the templates coming out. Enrollment is down but attendance is up from this time last year. The 313 agreements will be addressed next month. The Tennyson project has sent in an amendment to the Comptroller. The Norton project will have changes but it shouldn't impact the current year finances.

Mr. Siler advised there is currently come problems with the sewer in the first hallway and the sinks have been backing up into Mrs. Jones' classroom sink. A plumber came but he is not sure when they are coming back as their snake became stuck. He also thinks there will need to be a conversation in the future about expanding the agriculture facility.

Mr. Siler will go over sealed bids from architecture/engineering firms and present to the board at the December meeting.

Discussion was held regarding the board of directors for the Runnels County Appraisal

District. Jodie Arrott made the resolution to allocate 41 votes to Mr. Alvin Dunn, 41 votes to Mr. Joe Gerhart, and 40 votes to Mr. Johnny Pritchard, for a total of 122 votes. Josh Schoenfield seconded and the motion passed with a vote of 6 - 0.

Discussion was held regarding the board of directors for the Coke County Appraisal District. Josh Schoenfield made the resolution to allocate 340 votes to Ryan Webb and 340 votes to Paul Williams, for a total of 680 votes. Lynsey Coalson seconded

and the motion passed with a vote of 6 - 0.

Monique Bilyeau presented the G/T Handbook. She advised that BISD had someone from Region 15 come and look at the handbook and make recommendations on what should be changed. Some changes were made, including the change to add social/emotional learning. Ashley Braswell made the motion to approve as presented, seconded by Terry Queen. The motion passed with a vote of 6 - 0.
