Millican Sees Tax Revenue Needs

Marshall Millican has been a resident of Coke County over fifty (50) yrsrs. Marshall remembers the mid to late 1960's during the completion stages of the dam that created E.V. Spence Reservoir. Marshall recalls the Colorado River in its natural state running through the fertile farmlands along the river bottom. Thousands of acres of farm and ranchlands were purchased by the Colorado River Municipal Water District. Some of these properties were acquired by condemnation that caused many Coke County tax payers to relocate and move their families from their homes.

The Colorado River Municipal Water District (CRMWD) pays no county property taxes on land or improvements owned by the water district. CRMWD owns several hundred acres around Lake Spence that is above the 1,912 foot elevation which is the flood stage level of the lake. These properties should be sold at any price and be put back on the county tax roll. There are many changes that could be made by CRMWD that would benefit Coke County and Robert Lee. Some of these changes may need to be done by our Texas Legislation.

Marshall says, "If going to Austin is what it takes to get this done, I'm ready. I'm sure that Coke County is not the only county that has these problems where CRMWD has holdings"

"I am aware of many properties in Coke County that are delinquent on our tax rolls. If I am elected Commissioner of Precinct 3, I will be aggressive in working with the delinquent tax attorney firm for collections or sales of these properties to return them to active status on the tax roll."
