Ammunition Shortages

Maybe you have seen the reports on the internet about the government buying up all the ammo so the average American can't find any. This is not totally fiction. For instance, the Social Security Administration, which employs 295 special agents that carry guns, recently ordered 174,000 rounds of pistol ammo. That works out to be 590 rounds per agent per year. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, which has 63 personnel that carry weapons, ordered 46,000 rounds of .40 caliber bullets. That amounts to 730 rounds per officer per year. To top it all, the Department of Homeland Security has solicited 450 million rounds of .40 caliber bullets to be delivered over the next 5 years. That department has roughly 65,000 law enforcement officers. That's 1,384 rounds per officer per year. Is it any wonder that we can't find ammunition?

On the other hand, the ammunition manufacturers in the US produce over 1 billion rounds of .22's per year and the government doesn't buy any of them. I personally have a few boxes set aside for future use. I'm sure you do too.

We seem to have a "get it while you can" mentality about ammunition. We experienced the same type of panic when Obama was first elected. However, guns and ammunition slowly reappeared on the shelves of your local sporting goods store. That same scenario is likely to happen again.
