table. Jennie was not a big talker; she left that to Roy, but she was witty and fun loving. Many great family memories were made at the game table. Her pleasure in card playing continued right up to her death. She was always up for one more game of Canasta.

Jennie and Roy were attentive loving parents, very involved throughout their children's school years, following, and supporting them in all extracurricular activities, including stock shows and sporting events. Their love of sports took them to many football, basketball, and soccer games as well as car races and dance recitals. Their enjoyment in these activities continued through their children, grandchildren and great grandchildren, and extended family. Additionally, both Jennie Lee and Roy were supporters of all Robert Lee athletes.


