County Commissioners meeting minutes told

The Coke County Commissioners Court met in regular session on February 22, 2021, at 9 am, at the Courthouse in Robert Lee. Those in attendance included County Judge Hal Spain, Commissioner Precinct 1 Donald Robertson, Commissioner Precinct 2 Paul Williams, Commissioner Precinct 3 Marshall Millican,

Commissioner Precinct 4 Joe Sefcik, and Clerk Monica Reyes. The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag and prayer was offered by Judge Spain. Judge Spain announced the presence of a quorum. All were present. Commissioner Millican made a motion to approve the minutes and was seconded by Commissioner Robertson. The

motion carried. No action was taken regarding the burn ban. The burn ban remains off. The Auditor's Report was presented by Auditor Cindy Winchester. The Extension Report was presented by Extension Agent Morgan Runyan. No action was taken regarding resignations, terminations, transfers, etc. Commissioner Williams made

a motion to approve the budget amendments and line item transfers. Commissioner Sefcik seconded the motion and the motion carried. Sheriff Wayne McCutchen presented the Sheriff's Office Racial Profiling Report. Commissioner Sefcik made a motion to approve the report, with Commissioner Robertson seconding. The motion carried. Constable Marty Boyd presented the Constable's Office Racial Profiling Report. Commissioner Robertson made a motion to approve the report and was seconded by Commissioner Millican. The motion carried. Commissioner Williams made a motion to approve the Coke County Financial Report for the

year ended September 3, 2020, from Wayne Barr with Eckert & Company. Commissioner Millican seconded the motion and the motion carried. Commissioner Williams made a motion to oppose SB234/HB749 and was seconded by Commissioner Sefcik. The motion carried. Commissioner Williams made a motion to approve the extension of the Coke County Disaster Declaration through March 8, 2021. Commissioner Robertson seconded the motion and the motion carried. Commissioner Williams made a motion to approve the bills and was seconded by Commissioner Sefcik. The motion carried. Judge Spain adjourned the meeting at 10:20 am.
