Don't send money to someone you've never met.

Don't click on links or open attachments in unsolicited emails.

Don't believe everything you see.

Don't buy online unless the transaction is secure.

Be extremely cautious when dealing with anyone you've met online.

Never share personally identifiable information.

Don't be pressured to act immediately.

Use traceable secure, transactions when making payments for goods and services. Whenever possible, work with

local businesses that have proper identification, licensing and

insurance. Be cautious about what you share on social media and consider only connecting with people you already know.
