PERMIT TO REMAIN UPON PRIVATE OR PUBLIC PROPERTY WITH THE CITY OF

BRONTE, TEXAS, ANY JUNKED VEHICLE, PORTIONS OR DECLARING THE THEREOF, LEAVING OR PERMITTING TO REMAIN, OF ANY JUNKED MOTOR VEHICLE, OR PART OR PORTIONTHEREOF, UPON PRIVATE PUBLIC OR PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF BRONTE, TEXAS, (EXCEPT AS PROVIDED HEREIN) TO BE UNLAWFUL AND ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES ABATEMENT FOR AND REMOVAL JUNKED OF VEHICLES OR PARTS THEREOF, PUBLIC NUISANCES, AND FROM PRIVATE PROPERTY OR PUBLIC PROPERTY, PROVIDING THAT NOTICE BE GIVEN; PROVIDING A PENALTY; AND PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE.

WHEREAS, Subchapter E of the Texas Transportation Code authorized a municipality to adopt procedures for the abatement and removal of a junked vehicle from private or public property; and

private or public property; and NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Bronte, Texas:

SECTION 2.0 DEFINITIONS The following terms whenever used or referred to in the Ordinance shall have the same respective meaning clearly appears for the context:

2. "Abandoned motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle that:

a. is inoperable, is more than five years old, and has been left unattended on public property for more that seventy-two (72) hours;

b. has remained illegally on public property for more that seventy-two (72) hours; c. has remained of private property without the consent of the owner or person in charge of the property for more than seventy-two (72) hours. 5. "Junked vehicles" means any motor vehicle as defined in Vernon's Code Annotated, Texas Transportation Code Section 683.071 and as amended, which vehicle is self-propelled; and a. Does not have lawfully attached to it; i. An unexpired license plate; or ii. A valid motor vehicle inspection certificate; and b. is wrecked, dismantled or partially dismantled, or discarded; or c. is inoperable and remained inoperable for more than; i. 72 consecutive hours, if the vehicle is on public property; or ii. 30 consecutive days, if the vehicle is on private property.

SECTION 3.0 JUNKED VEHICLES DECLARED A PUBLIC NUISANCE

Junked vehicles which are located in any place where they are visible from a public place or public rightof-way, are detrimental to the safety and welfare of the general public, do tend to reduce the value of private property, do invite vandalism, do create fire hazards, do constitute an unattractive nuisance creating a hazard to the health and safety to minors, and are detrimental to the economic welfare of the State, by producing urban blight which is adverse to the maintenance and continuing development of the municipalities in the State of Texas, and such vehicle are, therefore, declared to be a public nuisance. SECTION 4.0 MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO CREATE OR TO MAINTAIN SUCH NUISANCE

It shall be unlawful for any individual, company or corporation to leave or permit to remain upon public or private property (except as hereinafter provided), within the City of Bronte, Texas, any junked vehicles or parts or portion thereof. SECTION 15.0 RIGHT OF REMOVAL FROM STREET PRESERVED

Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect ordinances or other laws that permit immediate removal of a vehicle left on public property which is abandoned or which constitutes an obstruction to traffic.

D SECTION 17.0 PENALTY

Any person who shall violate the terms and provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) and not more than Two HundredDollars (\$200.00) and each and every day this Ordinance is violated shall constitute a separate offense. The Court hearing a case under this Ordinance shall order abatement and removal of this nuisance on conviction.

SECTION 21.0 EFFECTIVE DATE This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as required by law, and it is so ordained. PASSED AND APPROVED ON
