Longhorns take championships in tournaments

The Bronte Longhorn Golf Team has participated in three recent tournaments, taking two championships and one reserve championship.

The Longhorns won the Robert Lee Tournament with a 367 score. Ty Lee posted an 89, Josh Puentez 92, Jared Scott 88, Lance Burns 98, and Ean Ward 110.

The Horns placed second at the Garden City Tournament held in Big Spring with an overall score of 338. Texas Brigades Youth camp slated

The Texas Brigades will add a new camp in the summer of 2013 appropriately named Ranch Brigade. The new camp will focus on an entirely new concept, livestock production and ranching.

The Texas Brigades' mission is to educate and empower youths with the leadership skills and knowledge in wildlife,

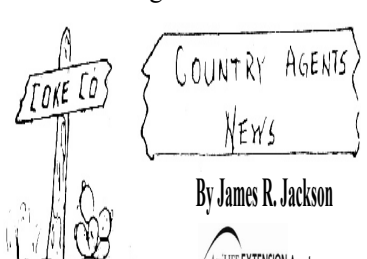
fisheries, and land stewardship to become conservation ambassadors for a sustained natural resource legacy. This will be the 21st year of the Brigades.

According to the camp coordinator, Chris Farley, Ranch Brigade will focus on the need for ranchers and agriculturalists to tell their story about land stewardship and livestock production.

"The camp will be about agriculture, food production, and feeding the world," Farley said. "I want the take-home message for the cadets to be 'ranchers have their consumer's best interest at heart'."

The founder of the Texas Brigades, Dr. Dale Rollins, says he is excited about the new camp because "It's a nice complement to our existing camps subject wise. Any program that promotes conservation and sharpens critical thinking skills is a winner." He adds that "wildlife and livestock can coexist if managed correctly—the more we can advance that synergy, the better off Texas rural lands will be."

Spring Green up Horticulture Hints

Now that springtime has arrived and the plants are starting to make buds, it is time to think about yard care. For those who circumstances permit they should start watering their trees that are starting to put on leaves. The slow spring time growth can

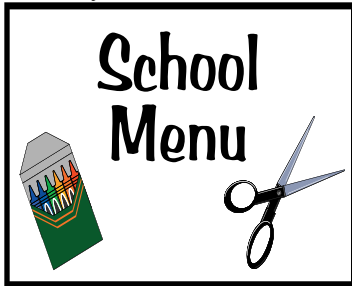
hinder the trees ability to withstand the summer time temperatures that we will get as we move into the summer time". To help increase the trees growth rate in the spring time and to get the tree to the point where it will withstand the high summer time temperatures a small amount of water now will help in getting the tree to that point. By watering the tree as little as 1-2 inches you may be able to go for as long as 2-3 weeks until the next watering depending on the amount of wind, temperatures and if we get any rain within the time period.

Fertilizing the trees and shrubs benefit them very little if done in the summer time; however, by doing this in the springtime (now) the benefits increase. In the Coke County area the nutrient that the soil is most lacking in is nitrogen. Any fertilizer that contains the numbers 21-7-14, 16-4-8 or 21-0-0 all will benefit the trees and shrubs when applied in the spring time when the trees buds turn green and the tree is starting to put on leaves.

In closing this week column I would like to end with a quote from the retired Tom Green County horticulture agent John Begnaud which is "how plants react to little or no water they receive later in the year can be influenced by the amount of water they receive in the late winter and early spring time".
