The guidelines for the scholarship are listed below.

The applicant must be an active CVEC member whose primary residence is served by CVEC or be the dependent of a

CVEC member whose primary residence is served by CVEC.

The applicant will be chosen based on the following criteria: grades, leadership, community, school activities, and essay.

Permissible use of the funds include payment of tuition, fees required for books, supplies, and/or equipment required for courses of instruction.

The recipient must attend a

recognized Texas institution of higher education, including certified trade schools, while pursuing a degree at any level.

Recipients must obtain at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale and carry a minimum of 12 hours or be considered by the registrar to be a full-time student. One half of the scholarship is awarded at the beginning of the fall semester

and the remaining half is awarded at the beginning of the spring semester.
