Commissioners Court minutes posted

The Coke County Commissioners Court met in special session March 22, 2016 at the courthouse in Robert Lee. Members of the court present included County Judge, Roy Blair, Commissioner, Pct. #1 Troy Montgomery, Commissioner Pct. #2 Paul William, Commissioner, Pct. #3 Gaylon Pitcock, Commissioner, and Pct. #4 Joe Sefcik. Clerk Mary Grim was also in attendance.

The meeting opened with prayer given by Commissioner Williams and pledge to the flag was recited.

Judge Blair announced the presence of a quorum.

Jason Clinton with SKG Engineering presented to the court different options for the CETRZ project.

Commissioner Montgomery made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Sefcik to set the specifications for Coke County: right of way minimum 80 feet to 120 feet maximum, width minimum of 20 feet, 4 inch base compaction or 4 inch or better caliche or available materials, roadways clear of brush and debris. All county road shall be named. Street signs shall be consistent in size and color. Signs shall be set at a reasonable height and distance to facilitate location by emergency vehicles. Try to control all water. The county shall not pay for any portion of the cost of constructing or maintaining a private road. Motion carried.

Auditor Vallery Jonson presented to the Court Line Item Transfers. Commissioner Montgomery made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Williams to approve the Line Item Transfers as presented. Motion carried.

Commissioner Williams made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Montgomery to approve the resignation of Asst. Auditor Kenda Rasco. Motion carried.

Judge Blair reported on drug and alcohol documentation.

Judge Blair adjourned the meeting at 10:35 A.M.
