The meeting was called to order at 5 pm by President Washam and a quorum was present.

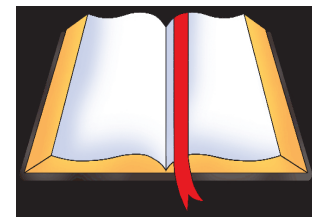
