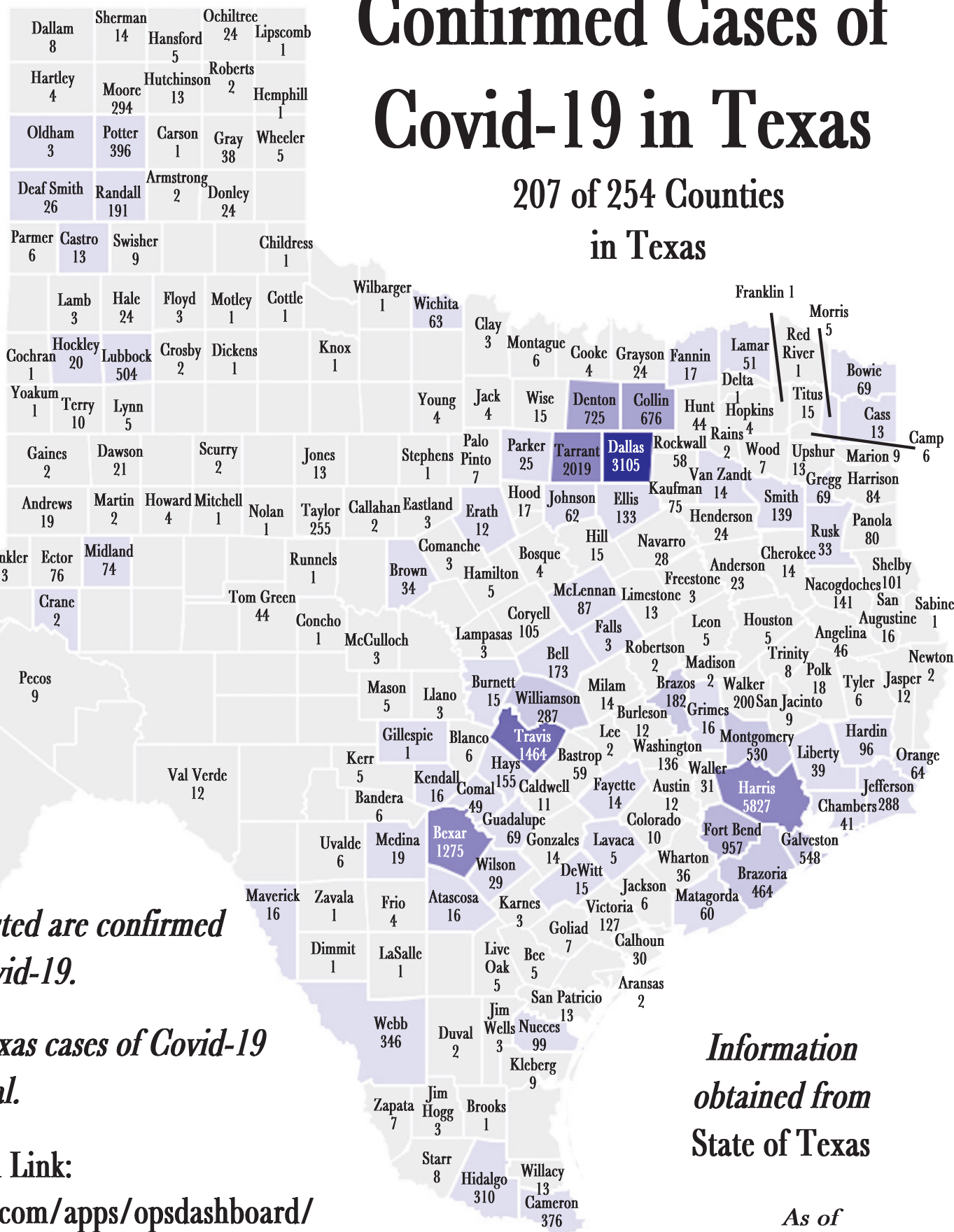

Virus draws nearer to Coke County as “Open Texas” Phase 1 begins today

According to official Texas state agencies, Coke County remains Covid-19 free as of Tuesday afternoon with no confirmed cases of the virus located within our borders. However, unconfirmed reports have at least one Coke County case due to be put on the state

maps in the next few days. The closest confirmed cases to our county are in Runnels County, Nolan County, Tom Green County, Taylor County and Mitchell County. County Judge Hal Spain, Coke County’s Emergency Management Coordinator, has

announced free Covid-19 testing at the EMS barn at 801 Highway 208 in Robert Lee tomorrow (Saturday) May 2, from 9 am to 5 pm. If you wish to be tested, you must register and make an appointment. You do not have to be screened for symptoms in order to be tested. Registration opens this morning (Friday), May 1. On Friday, you can go to the website TXCOVIDTEST.ORG or call

(512) 883-2400 to register and make an appointment. Judge Spain also announced on Tuesday that the Coke County Courthouse in Robert Lee would be open to the public beginning Monday morning, May 4. Texas Governor Greg Abbott continued his Open Texas plan with Executive Order GA 18 issued Monday, April 27, 2020. Beginning today, Friday, May 1,

2020, many businesses in Texas will be allowed to re-open with 25% occupancy. Because Coke County is a Texas county with 0-5 positive cases, the 25% restriction imposed on other counties is set at 50% for Coke County businesses. Executive Order GA 18 opens the following businesses.

- In store retail
- Dine-in restaurants
