The "Defined Benefit" pension plan was established in 1936 in the Texas State Constitution. Education and educators were deemed important enough to the state to be included in the Constitution. Now, legislators are being encouraged to alter the long-standing plan to a "Define Contrituion" which does not include beneficiary coverage, nor health coverage, nor insurance and which runs out when the contribution of the retiree runs out.

Currently there are over 312,000 educational retirees or their beneficiaries in Texas who contribute about 7.2 billion dollars into the Texas economy. Texas teachers opted to pay into a pension plan supported by the


