## **Prom Safety**

High School proms are very expensive affairs. When you add up the prom dresses and tuxedos, prom tickets and pictures, limos, dining, flowers and special hairstyles and manicures. The price tag can really add up.

For parents, however, the primary pro-related concerns aren't financial. Our biggest prom worries are the risky behaviors associated with proms, most specifically alcohol and drugs and unsafe sex. It has become the night where teens' poor judgment and dangerous choices have become institutionalized. The following tips may ease

your prom anxieties, while helping to keep your kids as safe as possible.

PROM SAFETY TIPS

The Talk: Tell your children that you want them to have a wonderful, memorable prom. Keep that wish as a central focus. They need to give you their complete itinerary for the evening, including whom they will be with, where they'll be going after the prom and the phone numbers where you can contact them. Come to a fair decision on a curfew, based upon your children's past level of responsibility in this area.
